

Celtic Astrology

The Celts developed and used their own astrological system, centered around the Moon and the 13 lunar months, rather than the Sun. Paterson combines the observations of the ancient Druids with an updated version of a 4th-century decanate system to create a modern source of new astrological insights and concepts.

Each of the 13 signs is a lunar month, and associated with one of the 13 trees sacred to the Druids. Each "tree sign" includes a discussion of the Celtic mythology and gods/goddesses associated with the sign and the planet. Includes instructions on chart construction, sign division, and solstices, equinoxes, eclipses and moon aspects.
